The General Manager reported that at the April 23 meeting, a representative of Best Meter will be in attendance to explain the smart meter program and answer Directors' questions on the subject.

The General Manager reported that the District had received its expected shipment of dye tablets, and that he was considering preparing small water saving kits to be given to new District customers.

The General Manager reported that the District will be allowed to lease 750 acre-feet from the City of Azusa at 92% of the normal cost.

The General Manager reported that the emergency preparedness center is coming along, with some work yet to be completed for it to be fully functional.

The General Manager reported that the new Caselle software is fully implemented and in use.



Lease Water Rights

Azusa Valley Water Company has 750 acre-feet of production rights that are available for lease. The water rate for untreated water is \$834.00, we can get it at a rate of \$767.28 for a total of \$575,460.00 which would be a savings of \$50,040.00. With current conditions looking like another dry year it would be in the District's best interest to lease these rights.

Recommendation:

It is staff's recommendation that we lease 750 acre-feet of production rights from Azusa Valley Water Company.



Water Levels as of March 22, 2019

Listed below are the water levels in the Baldwin Park Key Well and Wells owned and operated by San Gabriel County Water District.

The Baldwin Park Key Well is located in the central portion of the San Gabriel Valley within the City of Baldwin Park and is used by the Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster to monitor changes in the groundwater supply for the Basin. Each vertical foot is equivalent to about 8,000 acre-feet of groundwater in the Main Basin. The Key Well elevation is measured at sea level.

Trust Investment

At the March 12, 2019 Board meeting, staff was asked to provide more information on investing two million dollars in a trust for CalPERS payments. I consulted Platinum Services and this is their assessment.

Setting up an irrevocable Section 115 Trust similar to the OPEB Trust the District currently has with CalPERS. The District would deposit excess money into the trust, and then those monies are invested by CalPERS with presumably a greater rate of return than the District is currently earning in the LAIF fund. The benefits of the Trust are that:

- 1. The value of the Trust assets reduced the Net Pension Obligation on the District's financial statements.
- 2. The funds will most like earn a higher rate of return allowing for more funds to pay the District's pension obligations.
- 3. The funds can be used like a Rate Stabilization fund in that the District can use the funds to pay employer contributions to CalPERS in years of budgetary pressures.
- 4. The funds can be used to pay down the Unfunded Liability if deemed financially advisable.

The drawbacks of a Section 115 Trust are that the funds can only be used for pension expenses, and there is the risk of negative market performance.
