MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF SAN GABRIEL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT HELD ON JANUARY 11, 2022

CALL TO ORDER A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the San Gabriel County

Water District was called to order on Tuesday, January 11, 2022, at 8366

Grand Avenue, Rosemead, California at the hour of 4:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL

The Board of Directors of the San Gabriel County Water District convened

a regular meeting on January 11, 2022. Present at the District office were General Manager Jim Prior, Carmen Corona, Casey Feilen, Directors Taylor, Cammarano, DeLaTorre, Chan, Sauceda and District Counsel

Koczanowicz.

AGENDA Upon motion by Director DeLaTorre, Seconded by Director Sauceda the

Board voted to adopt the agenda as presented; passed 5 - 0.

PUBLIC No members of public were present at the meeting.

COMMENT

MINUTES Upon motion by Director Chan and seconded by Director Sauceda, the

Board unanimously voted to approve the minutes for the special meeting of

the Board of Directors held on December 14, 2021.

DEMANDS Director DeLaTorre motioned to authorize payment from General Account

in the amount of \$492,853.32 (Check #s 21749-21793) and electronic funds transfer from the general account to the revolving account in the amount of \$180,202.97 (check #s 12651-126840). The motion was seconded by Director Chan. Director Chan made inquiries as to certain specific items including payments for repair work done on Well 14, State Water Board payment, and a pressure relief valve cost. He also enquired about USC

Backflow Foundation, Hilton and U.S. Bank payments on the EFT account. Director Cammarano asked about payments for cameras and meter refunds; Director Sauceda asked about the status of work on Roses Rd. and Director Taylor asked about purchases of survival kits. All questions were answered

satisfactorily by staff and Motion to approve passed on a 5-0 vote.

DISTRICT COUNSEL REPORT District Counsel did not have any significant issues to report.

ACTION ITEMS Approve purchase of one new truck

General Manager presented the item to the Board. Staff was able to locate one truck that was suitable for the purpose and negotiated a price of

approximately \$83,750, which included all additional tooling and equipment

needed to put the truck into service.

Director Cammarano expressed her concern about the high cost and was informed that this was the only truck available, and that replacement of the existing truck was necessary due to its deteriorating condition. Director DeLaTorre motioned for approval of the item, Director Sauceda seconded and motion passed on a 5-0 vote.

MISC INFORMATION

Board received and filed the Water Well report with comments from Director Taylor and explanation from staff regarding the status of Raymond Basin

GENERAL MANAGER COMMENTS

General Manager reported on following items:

- Two of the District's employees tested positive for Covid and starting in January the staff will be working in split shifts, with only half on site at any point in time.
- District received a \$20,000 arrearage payment from Water Board for losses sustained due to Covid-19
- The initial costs for feasibility evaluation of MWD connection are \$92,000 and will not be shared by Sunnyslope, due to an anticipated change in their position on that issue. This expenditure will need to be compared to costs and possible results of redrilling Well 8. Staff will provide the Board with the analysis and seek direction at a future meeting.
- LAFCO is seeking candidates for the Board position
- District's new Website is up and running
- T-shirts and Jackets have been ordered
- Del Mar job is almost completed, and bidding invitations are expected to go out in February for the Gerona Ave work
- GM had a meeting with 101 E Valley consultant to once again explain that no variances will be granted, and no sub-metering will be permitted on the project. Director Cammarano mentioned that she is aware that owner's representatives reached out to a Supervisor and Assemblyman in an unsuccessful attempt to pressure the District into changing its position on this issue.
- Curio project had some delays related to water line size issues.

Discussion of options related to MET connection vs. redrilling of Well 8

Director Chan wished a quick return to health for employees affected by Covid-19 and wished all staff a Happy New Year. Director Cammarano complemented and thanked Carmen and Casey for a great job on the Holiday luncheon and presentation.
