CALL TO ORDER A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the San Gabriel County

Water District was called to order on Tuesday, April 11, 2023, at 8366

Grand Avenue, Rosemead, California at the hour of 4:05 p.m.

ROLL CALL Present at the District office were General Manager Jim Prior, Carmen

Corona, Casey Feilen, Directors Cammarano, Taylor, DeLaTorre, Sauceda

and Mamdapurkar and District Counsel Koczanowicz.

AGENDA Upon motion by Director Taylor and seconded by Director Sauceda, the

Board voted unanimously to adopt the agenda as presented.

MINUTES Upon motion by Director Taylor and seconded by Director Sauceda, the

Board voted to approve the minutes for the meeting of the Board of

Directors held on June 27, 2023. Motion passed 5-0.

DEMANDS Director DeLaTorre motioned to authorize payments from the General

Account in the amount of \$284,736.60 (chk#22648-22693 including a voided check #22563) and an electronic funds transfer from the general account to the revolving account in the amount of \$18,192.52 (chk#13288-13319). The motion was seconded by Director Taylor. Staff answered questions to the satisfaction of the Board relating to check numbers 22662 to Doty Bros, 22666 to Flintridge Tree Care with an additional amount over the voided check; 22679 to Nobel Systems; 22664 to Fast Eddie's for dirt hauling and 22688 to So Cal Gas. Director Sauceda also asked about asbestos pipe in District water system and was assured by the General Manager that the small amount of piping still in the system did not create a health risk. Precautions will need to be taken if/when the pipe is removed or

disturbed. Motion passed on a 5-0 vote.

DISTRICT COUNSEL REPORT District Counsel briefed the Board on a recent Supreme Court decision in the County of Santa Clara vs. Doctors Medical Center of Modesto Inc., where the Court reversed the Court of Appeal's decision and found that the Hospital could pursue reimbursement for services provided to the members covered by the County Health Care system under the implied contract theory and that such action was not subject to the Tort Claim Act.

ACTION ITEMS: Board received a staff report with a recommendation to award the 2023

Mainline Replacement project to Fraijo Bros. Construction in the amount of \$601,889.71. General Manager responded to questions regarding wide range of bids. Director Taylor moved to accept staff's recommendation.

Director DeLaTorre seconded, and motion passed unanimously.

The Baldwin Park Key Well is located in the central portion of the San Gabriel Valley within the City of Baldwin Park and is used by the Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster to monitor changes in the groundwater supply for the Basin. Each vertical foot is equivalent to about 8,000 acre-feet of groundwater in the Main Basin. The Key Well elevation is measured at sea level.
