CALL TO ORDER A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the San Gabriel County

Water District was called to order on Tuesday, February 13, 2024, at 8366

Grand Avenue, Rosemead, California at the hour of 4:00 p.m.

**ROLL CALL** Present at the meeting were General Manager Jim Prior, Finance and

Administration Manager Carmen Corona, Assistant General Manager Casey

Feilen, Directors Cammarano, Taylor, DeLaTorre, Sauceda and

Mamdapurkar and District Counsel Koczanowicz.

AGENDA Upon motion by Director Taylor and seconded by Director Mamdapurkar,

the Board voted unanimously to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion

passed 5-0.

MINUTES Upon motion by Director DeLaTorre and seconded by Director Taylor, the

Board voted to approve the minutes for the regular meeting held on January

23, 2024. Motion passed 5-0.

**DEMANDS** Director DeLaTorre motioned to authorize payments from the General

Account in the amount of \$390,090.37 (chk#23011-23066) and an electronic funds transfer to the Revolving Account in the amount of

\$124,601.63 (chk#13545-13593 and voided Check#13571). The motion was

seconded by Director Sauceda. Director Cammarano asked about expenditures related to Nobel Systems subscription and the City of San Gabriel; Director DeLaTorre asked about payments to Cricket Consulting and Granger; Director Mamdapurkar asked about bee removal expenses and

Infosend. All questions were answered to Board's satisfaction. Motion

passed on a 5-0 vote.

DISTRICT COUNSEL REPORT District Counsel briefed the Board on a Court of Appeals decision in Mojave Pistachios vs. Indio Kern Ground Water Sustainability Agency et al.

Appellate Court upheld the lower Court's decision which granted a demurer

to the defendants based on the fact that the Plaintiffs failed to pay the

Replenishment Fees before filing an action to challenge their legality. Court upheld the longstanding principal that mandates payment of any taxes prior

to initiating an action to challenge those taxes. Keith Lemieux from Aleshire & Wynder was oner of the attorneys representing the prevailing

defendants.

**ACTION ITEMS** Board discussed the selection of Property Management firm for the

residential properties on Grand and on a motion by Director Taylor,

seconded by Director Sauceda on a 4-1 vote (Director Mamdapurkar voting

no) selected Jill Peterson of Re/Max Masters Realty to provide those services to the District. Staff was directed to enter into an agreement with Ms. Peterson subject to District Counsel review and approval.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 02-24-526**

# SAN GABRIEL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE TAXPAYER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY ACT, BALLOT INITIATIVE NO. 21-0042A1

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2023, a ballot initiative submitted by the California Business Roundtable, an organization comprised of the senior executive leadership of major California employers, qualified for the November 2024 statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the ballot initiative, named "The Taxpayer Protection and Government Accountability Act" (Ballot Initiative No. 21-0042A1), seeks to amend the California Constitution by enacting new and stricter rules for raising and increasing taxes, fees, and charges, and making it more difficult to pass measures needed to fund local services and infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Ballot Initiative No. 21-0042A1 would require all fees and charges be approved either by voters themselves or by an elected governing body; and

WHEREAS, the California Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance have opined that Ballot Initiative No. 21-0042A1 will reduce state and local revenues, potentially substantially; and

WHEREAS, Ballot Initiative No. 21-0042A1 would have significant negative impacts on the District's operations and ability to deliver its core services; and

WHEREAS, a broad coalition of local governments, labor, education and public safety leaders, infrastructure advocates, and businesses strongly oppose Ballot Initiative No. 21-0042A1; and

WHEREAS, a coalition of interested parties, including Governor Gavin Newsom and the State Legislature, have petitioned the California Supreme Court to enjoin submission of Ballot Initiative No. 21-0042A to the voters, arguing that it is constitutionally invalid; and

WHEREAS, the District's General Counsel has drafted this Resolution based upon the information available, with the understanding this information is complete, true, and accurate.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that we, the Sa Board of Directors, hereby oppose "The Taxpayer Protection Act" (Ballot Initiative No. 21-0042A1), which has qualified for Election.	and Government Accountability

Listed below are the water levels in the Baldwin Park Key Well and Wells owned and operated by San Gabriel County Water District.

The Baldwin Park Key Well is located in the central portion of the San Gabriel Valley within the City of Baldwin Park and is used by the Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster to monitor changes in the groundwater supply for the Basin. Each vertical foot is equivalent to about 8,000 acre-feet of groundwater in the Main Basin. The Key Well elevation is measured at sea level.
